About its unique location and attractions.



Nestled between rich forest resources and the swiftly flowing Kitayama River which winds through the mountains is Kitayama Village in Wakayama Prefecture. This village is known as Japan's only enclave village. Its designation comes from its unique location, as it is surrounded by Nara and Mie Prefectures, without any direct borders with municipalities in Wakayama. Kitayama Village is enveloped by forests, which constitute 97% of its area. The smallest village has a width of 20km from east to west and 8km from north to south, with a modest population of fewer than 400 inhabitants (as of 2023). Kitayama thrives on its primary industries of "IKADA-KUDARI" tourism log rafting" and the "JABARA" citrus fruit.

From the excavation of Jomon Period (pre-historic Japanese) archaeological sites, it is evident that people have been living in these deep mountainous regions since ancient times. Life in the mountainous areas has been sustained through forestry, and one such practice is log rafting. The tradition of rafting is still preserved today, notably in the form of tourist rafting, showcasing the enduring legacy of this classic technique.

IKADA-KUDARI

UNFORGETTABLE & UNPARALLELED JOURNEY AHEAD!

The Kitayama Gorge stretches along the Kitayama River in Wakayama Prefecture, offering a spectacular sight of 30-meterlong tourist log rafts called "ikada-kudari" navigating the river. These rafts are skillfully maneuvered to follow the flow, creating movements reminiscent of a dragon, accompanied by cheers echoing through the gorge.

This *ikada-kudari* experience is carefully preserved by Kitayama Village and takes place annually from May to September. The history of the *ikada-kudari* dates back over 600 years, with "*Ikadashi*" raftsmen playing a crucial role alongside forestry, garnering attention even from historical figures.

This is designated as an important intangible folk cultural property of Wakayama prefecture and is designated as a Forestry Heritage by the Japanese Forest Society (JFS).

Dive into nature



VILLAGE'S TREASURE

Jabara citrus, a seedless hybrid of yuzu and kunenbo, was discovered in Kitayama village, and registered as a new fruit variety in 1979. Initially restricted by agricultural regulations, only this region could produce the highly localized specialty.

Its name, "JABARA" signifies the removal of evil spirits. In 1977, cultivation aimed to make Jabara Kitayama's specialty began. Despite market challenges due to the area's topography, increased sales through internet shopping and reported anti-allergic properties led to rapid growth. Jabara, with a tart orange-lemon flavor and antihistamine properties, is processed into various products.

BLESSINGS OF THE MOUNTAINS

In the present day, Jabara production is the village's main industry. Utilizing the hometown tax system and supporting finances, Kitayama Village aims to preserve local employment. A savior for the small village, Jabara has become a unique product both in name and reality. Every November, the entire village comes together to harvest. However, due to the limited farmland in this small village, only about 100 tons are harvested each year. Therefore, these fruits have become precious.

We cultivate Jabara meticulously, as it is a variety born in the unique climate of Kitayama Village. Even if Jabara is grown elsewhere, it might differ slightly from the original variety native to this region. Considering this, in a small mountain village that has experienced depopulation without significant industries since the modern era, Jabara can be considered a treasure bestowed upon us by the local deity.

Nowadays, every autumn, the village holds a Harvest Festival, the largest festival of the year. The festival serves as an event to express gratitude for the bounty of Jabara harvest and has become a communal gathering for people to relax and interact.

UNIQUE LOCATION


THE ENCLAVE VILLAGE KITAYAMA

Although Kitayama Village is located in Wakayama Prefecture, all the towns and villages adjacent to it belong to Mie and Nara Prefectures. It is a curious reality where Kitayama Village does not share borders with any municipality within Wakayama Prefecture. This unique feature distinguishes Kitayama Village, earning it the "enclave" title in Japan. The village is the only place with such a geographical anomaly, a phenomenon exclusive to this region in Japan.

Since ancient times, Kitayama Village has thrived in the forestry industry, having been blessed with high-quality cedar. The timber harvested was transported using rafts on the river, reaching the timber storages in Shingu.

During that era, the majority of Kitayama Village's population comprised of raftsmen. The relationship between Shingu's timber merchants and the raftsmen was one of coexistence and mutual prosperity, forming an inseparable bond.

In the 4th year of the Meiji era, with the abolition of the han system, Shingu was incorporated into Wakayama Prefecture. Geographically, Kitayama was considered part of Nara Prefecture, but upon hearing the opinion of the villagers— 'If Shingu is joining Wakayama, then we'd like to join too'—Kitayama Village was incorporated into Wakayama Prefecture.



Kitayama Village is located in the Kumano region, representing the "Sacred Sites and Pilgrimage Routes in the Kii Mountain Range," a UNESCO World Heritage site. Kumano is the ancient name for the southern region of the Kii peninsula - a sacred site steeped in mystery and legend. Kumano's rich natural landscape is believed to be the otherworldly abode of the gods, and has been the focus of pilgrimage and spiritual training for centuries.

The path of Ikada-shi

The trekking route of 'Ikada-shi' the Raftman's way.

In an era without roads or vehicles, raftsmen navigated the rivers on log rafts, carrying their oars and walking over the deep mountains to return to the village. Even now, remnants of that time, such as village ruins and traces of their paths, remain. This path, which has become a natural hiking trail, has gained popularity in recent years as a beautiful trekking route where one can learn about both the history of the raftsmen and the natural surroundings.

Roadside Station Okutoro serves as a tourism hub with hot springs, accommodation facilities, restaurants, shops, a tourist information center, a base for rafting activities, and ikada-kudari reception. Along the Kitayama River, it features a promenade that boasts a beautiful park as well as camping facilities. In spring, visitors can also enjoy the breathtaking view of cherry blossoms in full bloom.
