# Kumano Hongu Taisha Grand Shrine




founded in 33 B.C. at the sandbank of three rivers meet where is now called

After the big flood of Kumano-gawa River in 1889, unflowed four shrines were moved to the present site.

Surrounded by cedar trees, the shrine buildings with cypress-bark-covered roofs are filled with traditional atmosphere.

In the year 128, the deities of Kumano noved from Kamikura-jinja Shrine, where hey had first descended to Earth, to their urrent location here

Within the shrine grounds is a roughly 1000 year-old Nagi (Asian bayberry) tree. There is a tradition of keeping a leaf from this tree inside one's clothes, in prayers for safety during the Kumano pilgrimage.
